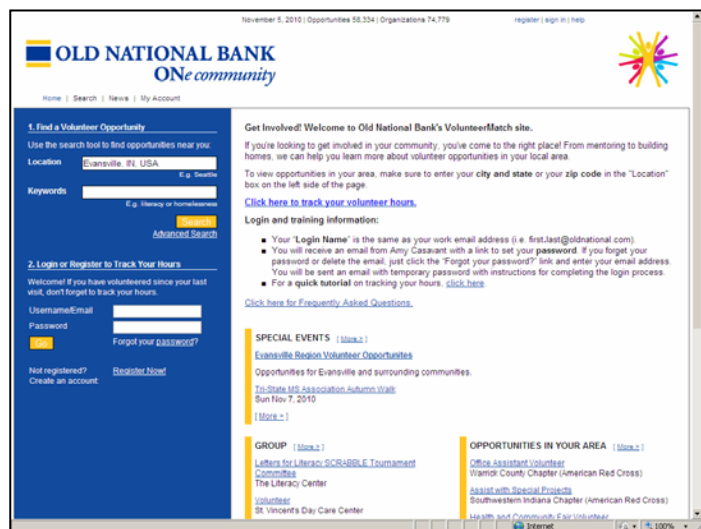

Monroe Bancorp Partnership

Old National has entered into an agreement to acquire Monroe Bancorp, headquartered in Bloomington, Indiana. A total of 15 branches are involved in the transaction, and this partnership includes more than \$680 million in deposits and nearly \$850 million in total assets, including a Trust portfolio valued at \$336 million.



With a 118-year legacy of service to clients and community, Monroe is a true community bank and a leader in the Bloomington market (first in market share and total deposits). Much like Old National, it is a highly regarded institution with a focus on basic banking and a well-earned reputation for community involvement. This partnership will enable Monroe's loyal client base to continue to bank with a community focused, Indiana-based financial institution.

This acquisition moves Old National closer to its stated goal of being recognized as Indiana's bank by expanding our reach and dramatically increasing our market share in the historic town of Bloomington, home to the state's signature university. It also expands our Central Indiana footprint and enhances our ability to serve the Indianapolis market with the addition of four "brick and mortar" branches in the Greater Indianapolis area (Avon, Brownsburg, Noblesville and Plainfield).

This partnership represents a tremendous cultural fit, allowing Old National to welcome a new population of clients and associates who are well-accustomed to a service- and community-oriented style of banking.

"What makes this partnership so exciting is that it joins together two like-minded financial institutions with rich legacies of service to clients and communities," said Bob. "This alliance is such a tremendous fit for both banks, and it enables Monroe clients and employees to continue a very successful community-banking model."
